You can find it <u>here</u> or on the Wyandotte County Extension office website.


There are several new divisions and classes that have been added to the 4-H show this year as well as a few rule changes to other classes. Be sure to look over the classes you plan to enter in the fair to make sure you understand the rules and judging guidelines.



#### **YQCA** Information

All 4-H youth who are exhibiting any livestock animal in the 4-H classes at the Wyandotte County Fair are required to complete the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals certification (YQCA) through an in-person or online course.

A copy of the certificate of completion is due to the 4-H Agent by **June 15.** 



Uploading the YQCA certificate to 4H Online is recommended, but will not be sufficient to show completion. A copy of the 2024 YQCA certificate must be on file at the WyCo 4-H Office.

The online courses cost \$12. Visit YQCAprogram.org for more information and to take the course.

# 2024 4-H County Fair Info

The WyCo 4-H program will use the Fair Entry system for entering 4-H projects, recording results, and premiums earned at the county fair. All projects that are to be judged in the 4-H division classes must be entered through Fair Entry.

FairEntry will open for entries on **June 10** and will close on **June 28**.


